Fifteenth Extraordinary Session Geneva, April 3, 1998

REPORT

adopted by the Council

Opening of the Session

- 1. The Council of the International Union for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants (UPOV) held its fifteenth extraordinary session in Geneva, on April 3, 1998, under the chairmanship of Mr. Ryusuke Yoshimura (Japan), President of the Council.
- 2. The session was opened by the <u>President</u>, who welcomed the participants.
- 3. The <u>President</u> welcomed in particular the Delegations of Bulgaria, the Russian Federation, and Trinidad and Tobago, countries which had become members of UPOV or had deposited an instrument of accession since the last (thirty-first) ordinary session of the Council. He also announced that the 1991 Act of the UPOV Convention would enter into force on April 24, 1998, on which day it would bind the following six countries: Bulgaria, Denmark, Israel, the Netherlands, the Russian Federation and Sweden.
- 4. The list of participants is given in the Annex to this report.

Adoption of the Agenda

5. The <u>Council</u> adopted the agenda as given in document C(Extr.)/15/1 after having noted that it was called upon to consider the laws and draft laws of Brazil, Nicaragua and Venezuela under item 3.

Examination of the Conformity of the Legislation of the Republic of Croatia with the 1991 Act of the UPOV Convention

- 6. Discussions were based on document C(Extr.)/15/2.
- 7. The <u>Council</u> decided, on the basis of the conclusions drawn by the Office of the Union in paragraphs 25 and 26 of document C(Extr.)/15/2,
- (a) to advise the Government of Croatia that the Law, when supplemented by Regulations and with the incorporation of suitable amendments, would provide the basis for a law conforming with the 1991 Act;
- (b) to request the Office of the Union to offer its assistance to the Government of Croatia in respect of the amendments and the Regulations that were necessary to achieve conformity;
 - (c) to further advise the Government of Croatia that
 - (i) after the enactment of a law on the revision of the Law in accordance with the suggestions of the Office of the Union, but without other substantial changes, and the making of necessary Regulations, and
 - (ii) after consultation of the Office of the Union as to whether the amendments to the Law and the Regulations were adequate,

it would be able to deposit an instrument of accession to the 1991 Act.

Examination of the Conformity of the Legislation of Brazil with the 1978 Act of the UPOV Convention

- 8. Discussions were based on document C(Extr.)/15/4.
- 9. The <u>Council</u> decided, on the basis of the conclusions drawn by the Office of the Union in paragraph 17 of document C(Extr.)/15/4,
- (a) to advise the Government of Brazil that its Law and Regulations conformed with the 1978 Act of the UPOV Convention;
- (b) to request the Secretary-General to inform the Government of Brazil of its decision.

Examination of the Conformity of a Bill of the Republic of Nicaragua with the 1978 Act of the UPOV Convention

- 10. Discussions were based on document C(Extr.)/15/5.
- 11. The <u>Council</u> decided, on the basis of the conclusions drawn by the Office of the Union in paragraphs 34 to 36 of document C(Extr.)/15/5,
- (a) to advise the Government of Nicaragua that the Bill, when supplemented by implementing regulations and after elimination of Article 69, provided the basis for a law conforming with the 1978 Act;
- (b) to request the Office of the Union to offer its assistance to the Government of Nicaragua in respect of the amendments and improvements to be made to the Bill and the drafting of the implementing regulations;
 - (c) to further advise the Government of Nicaragua that
 - (i) after the enactment into law of the Bill incorporating the amendments suggested by the Office of the Union, but without other substantial changes, and the making of necessary regulations, and
 - (ii) after consultation of the Office of the Union as to whether the amendments and Regulations were adequate,

it would be able to deposit an instrument of accession to the 1978 Act by April 24, 1999, at the latest.

- 12. The Council further noted that the Bill incorporated essential features of the 1991 Act and would conform to the latter if the following main changes were effected:
- (a) an extension of the material basis of the breeder's right to harvested material under the condition set out in Article 14(2) of the 1991 Act;
 - (b) the introduction of provisional protection;
 - (c) an extension of the duration of protection.

It requested the Office of the Union to advise the Government of Nicaragua on the rationale of the provisions referred to above and the benefits that would be derived from them.

Examination of the Conformity of the Legislation of Venezuela with the 1978 and 1991 Acts of the UPOV Convention

- 13. Discussions were based on document C(Extr.)/15/6.
- 14. The <u>Council</u> decided, on the basis of the conclusions drawn by the Office of the Union in paragraphs 45 and 46 of document C(Extr.)/15/6,

- (a) to take a positive decision on the conformity of the legislation of Venezuela with the provisions of the 1978 Act and the 1991 Act, subject to some amendments being made to the draft Regulations;
- (b) to request the Office of the Union to offer its assistance to the Government of Venezuela in respect of the amendments to be made to the draft Regulations;
 - (c) to further advise the Government of Venezuela that
 - (i) after consultation with the Office of the Union as to whether the amendments to the Regulations were adequate, and
 - (ii) after adoption of the Regulations incorporating such amendments, but without other substantial changes,

it would be able to deposit an instrument of accession to the 1978 Act prior to April 24, 1999, or to the 1991 Act at any time.

Amendment of the Program and Budget of the Union for the 1998-99 Biennium

- 15. Discussions were based on document C(Extr.)/15/3.
- 16. The <u>Council</u> reiterated its appreciation to the Secretary-General for his decision to renounce his right to receive an indemnity from UPOV, and adopted the amendments to the program and budget of UPOV for the 1998-99 biennium set out in document C(Extr.)/15/3.

Any Other Business: Relations Between UPOV and WTO

- 17. The <u>Council</u> noted that the Administrative and Legal Committee had considered the question of the relations of UPOV and WTO in the context of the review, in 1999, of Article 27.3.b) of the TRIPS Agreement, and had recommended that the representatives of member States in UPOV circles contact their counterparts in WTO in order to make them aware of the need to give a more prominent place to the UPOV Convention in the TRIPS Agreement.
- 18. The <u>Council</u> decided to request the Secretary-General to enter into consultations with the Chairman of the Council for TRIPS ensure that the UPOV Convention be specifically mentioned in Article 1 of the TRIPS Agreement as another Convention providing standards for intellectual property protection, on the occasion of the general review of the implementation of the Agreement in the year 2000.
 - 19. The Council unanimously adopted this report at the close of its session.
