Policy

Australian legislation allows the use of DUS test reports produced by other authorities under certain conditions.

- An application for the candidate variety has been lodged overseas, and the variety has been test grown by a UPOV member using UPOV test guidelines/protocols, and
- either, all the most similar varieties of common knowledge (including those in Australia) have been included in the overseas DUS trial, or

Policy (cont.)

- the new variety is so clearly distinct from all the Australian varieties of common knowledge that further DUS test growing is not warranted, and
- sufficient information is available to publish a description of the variety; and to satisfy the requirements of the Australian PBR Act

Benefits

Reduced costs
 when DUS trial is not required

or

where a growing of only the candidate is required (verification trial).

• Can save time, if DUS report is already available.

Exceptions

- Potatoes Overseas DUS test reports cannot be used.
 It is a requirement that a DUS trial be conducted in Australia.
- The final decision on the acceptability of the overseas DUS report rests with the PBR office.
