

EVANS SIKINYI

Dr Evans Sikinyi is Executive officer of the Seed Trade Association of Kenya (STAK). He is the Secretary of the Eastern Africa Seed Committee (EASCOM), that is charged with implementation of the harmonization of seed regulation within the region. He previously was the Head, Seed Certification and Plant Variety Protection at the Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Service (KEPHIS). He holds a PhD (Iowa State University), Horticulture (breeding and biotechnology), Masters of Science in plant breeding and Bachelors of Science in Agriculture (University of Nairobi). He was instrumental in setting and operating the Plant variety protection system in Kenya. He trained in Intellectual Property at Michigan State University, Cambridge in the United Kingdom, at WIPO and UPOV in Geneva, and at the United States Patent Office (USPTO), among other places. He is a trained trainer in intellectual property (USPTO Global Intellectual Property Academy) particularly plant variety protection. He was a key member of the task force that developed the Seed Policy for Kenya and the Vice-chair of the task force for developing policy and laws for Traditional Knowledge, Genetic Resources and Folklore in Kenya. He is a member of the Expert Advisory Committee of the Central Advisory Service on Intellectual Property for the CGIAR. He has led the Kenyan delegation to the International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture, apart from being a member of the Ad-Hoc Advisory Committee on the Funding Strategy for the Benefit Sharing Fund. He has been a member of the UPOV Council, Administrative and Legal Committee, Technical Committee and member of various Technical Working Parties in UPOV.
