Mr. Lloyd Le Page is CEO of the CGIAR Consortium of International Agricultural Research Centres, formed in 2010 as a key component of the CGIAR reform process, and based in Montpellier, France. The Consortium represents 15 member centers operating in over 200 locations worldwide and works to reduce poverty and hunger, improve human health and nutrition, and enhance ecosystem resilience through high-quality international agricultural research, partnership and leadership.

Prior to his current role Lloyd led the Sustainable Agriculture and Development program at Pioneer Hi-Bred, a DuPont business. The program was focused on creating novel partnerships and innovative business approaches to reach previously under-served markets and to provide a foundation for sustainable business and community growth. In this role Lloyd interacted at all levels with private, public, non-profit and academic sectors both in the US and in developing countries. Previously Lloyd worked for Pioneer as regional supply chain manager for Africa, and previously as production manager for South Africa and Zimbabwe. In these roles Lloyd managed large capital expansion projects as well as addressing supply chain and product deployment challenges of reaching small and large farmers in Africa. He was also involved with trade and regulatory issues of seed movement and was responsible for implementing quality management systems such as ISO9001:2000 in Zimbabwe, South Africa and Egypt. Lloyd participated in various committees of Africa-Bio, SANSOR and the Seed Trade. Prior to joining Pioneer, Lloyd worked for several farming operations and agribusinesses in Zimbabwe.

Lloyd has served on many not-for-profit Boards, and including the African Seed Trade Association, Global Child Nutrition Foundation, the Association for International Agriculture and Rural Development.
